Subject Updates

Kindergarteners are learning how to hold a pencil properly, color, write and recognize the letter "i" and its sounds, and math place words above, middle, and below.

First graders and second graders have done math pages that reviewed what they learned last year to warm up their brains. They have begun to work in Mobymax math on ipads. First graders have reviewed short vowel sounds in phonics while second graders have learned to recognize action words.

All grades have learned about how God talked to Samuel and some others in the Bible and how He talks to us now through the Bible. We have also explored seeds together for science by naming them, observing them, and watching a video about how seeds travel.
